The Convention on Cluster Munitions
Becomes International Law on
1 August 2010;
30 countries ratified the Convention on
16 February 2010.

Committment to:

What is the Convention on Cluster Munitions?

The Convention on Cluster Munitions, CCM, prohibits all use, stockpiling, production and transfer of Cluster Munitions. Separate articles in the Convention concern assistance to victims, clearance of contaminated areas and destruction of stockpiles. The Convention was adopted in Dublin by 107 states on 30 May 2008 and signed on 3 December the same year. The Convention became binding international law when it entered into force on 1 August 2010.

What can I do?

TAKE ACTION NOW!!!

- Check your country's position on the Cluster Munitions Convention (CCM)
- Ask your government to sign or ratify the CCM
- Ask your government to attend the First Meeting of States Parties to the CCM in Laos in November 8-12, 2010
- Celebrate the entry of CCM as International Law on 1 August with people around the world by:
 - -- Inviting your friends to drum and dance with a drummer or a band
 - -- Praying for peace in your church, temple, mosque or garden



"I was digging in the soil when I hit a cluster submunition in 1996. I was taken to the hospital where I spent the next 6 weeks recovering. Sadly I lost my left arm. What are cluster bombs?

Cluster munitions are large weapons which are deployed from the air and from the ground and release dozens or hundreds of smaller submunitions. Submunitions released by air-dropped cluster bombs are most often



called "bomblets," while those delivered from the ground by artillery or rockets are usually referred to as "grenades."


What is the problem?



Air-dropped or groundlaunched, they cause two major humanitarian problems and risks to civilians. First, their widespread dispersal means they cannot distinguish between military targets and civilians so the humanitarian impact can be extreme, especially when the weapon is

used in or near populated areas.

Many submunitions fail to detonate on impact and become de facto antipersonnel mines killing and maiming people long after the conflict has ended. These duds are more lethal than antipersonnel mines; incidents involving submunition duds are much more likely to cause death than injury.
